A dumpster is needed to clean out the Opera House, so far \$3,333 has been raised for Opera House renovations.

R .Harn reported that the Westgate Public Library is now accredited at the highest Tier possible. To achieve this, the Llibrary must meet a minimum of 67 standards in the areas of Library Governance, Library Management, Library Personnel, Library Collections, Library Access (including physical spaces and virtual spaces), Library Programming and Community Relations, and Library Facility. The Library must meet all the same standards as any other Library in the State regardless of size. There will be a Summer Reading Program for Children preschool thru 5<sup>th</sup> grade welcome. meeting Thursday , July 8 at 3:00 pm. Two board members have resigned , . Mayor Rubendall appointed Rosie Crouch and Tammy Walenceus as New Board members. Library Board meeting will be the 3<sup>rd</sup> Tuesday of the month.

City Clerk reports that Bents Smokehouse and Pub is now showing that Dram Shop Insurance is on file and the Local Authority portion has been completed.

Motion Moore seconded Rover to have Maurer Tree Service remove 6 Ash Trees at 220 Cass Street S. at a cost of \$2400, with Wilharm Stump Removal to remove six stumps at a cost of \$80 each. All ayes motion carried.

Motion Hannan seconded D Wolff to approve the bills as amended all ayes motion carried.
